## PREFACE.

This "Book of Honor" is produced to fulfil a promise made by the Compiler in his previous book "The Australian Y.M.C.A. with the Jewish Soldier of the A.I.F.," published in London in 1919.

The preparation of this "Book of Honor" has been a long and difficult task, owing to the absence of any complete centralized official record of the Jewish Personnel in the A.I.F.

The Records here produced have been secured from many and varied sources, including the compiler's own personal records during his services abroad, from Australian and English Jewish Chaplains, and from Australian Communal Records. Thanks are due to the Officials of the Congregations concerned for their sympathetic co-operation and to the Secretary of Defence for his official verification of the records submitted to him.

## GENERAL SURVEY.

---

**A**LTHOUGH this Record has had exhaustive editing and verification, it does not pretend to be either complete or without fault. Everything, however, has been done to make it authoritative and official, and where error has crept in it will be found to be on the conservative side. Owing to the absence of any central Australian Jewish Authority the compiler felt peculiarly able, owing to his specialized Jewish War Services abroad, to undertake the task voluntarily, believing in the necessity and value of such a Record, and the faults, errors and omissions of the production are entirely his, and for which he craves the leniency and indulgence of readers.

The object of the Book is to place on permanent record Australian Jewry's practical part in the Great War, and to establish beyond question that Jewish citizens of the Empire, no less than members of any other Faith, are prepared to share the full burden of its citizen responsibilities as well as its privileges.

For a comprehensive and complete Record of British Jewry's Military efforts throughout the Empire, the reader is referred to "The British Jewry Book of Honour," published last year in London, and edited by the Rev. Michael Adler, D.S.O., Senior Jewish Chaplain, and published by the Caxton Publishing Co.

This magnificent record comprises the official statistics of the 50,000 British Jews who served throughout the War in every field and phase, and from every corner of the far-flung British Empire. Of these over 2,425 made the Supreme Sacrifice, and over 6,500 were wounded. When it is realised that there are only 420,000 Jews in the British Empire, this record can be looked upon with pride by all Jews.

One thousand five hundred and ninety-six Military Decorations and Honors were awarded, com-



prising 5 V.C.'s, one of which was an Australian. There were only 578 V.C.'s awarded among the 6,000,000 men on active service in the British Forces.

The record for Australia shows that there were at least 1,500 Australian Jewish men who voluntarily enlisted and served abroad. Of this number over 200 laid down their lives and a very large percentage were wounded; 192 held commissioned rank, whilst 95 received Honors and Distinctions, including Lt. L. M. Keyzor, of the 42nd Battalion, who received the V.C.

In view of the many difficulties in verifying the Jewish Record, and the fact that the records attached hereto have been compiled on the conservative side, it can be assumed that the above estimates are well within the mark.

Comparative statistics between the Jewish Service and General Service will substantiate the claim that the Jewish members of the Community stood up to their rightful obligations in proportion to their numbers in the community.

An inspection of the nominal roll will show also that most of the men served in active fighting forces, which is also shown by the number killed.

Apart from the enlistments in the A.I.F. there were a considerable number of Australian Jews who served in other Dominion Forces or with the Imperial troops. There were also a small proportion of Jews serving in the Australian Navy, and Australian Jewish women served with the A.I.F. as Nurses, one of whom, Sister Leah Rosenthal, was decorated with the Royal Red Cross for conspicuous application to duty whilst in the danger zone.

There were also many Australian Jewish men and women doing important Munition work in the United Kingdom during the War, and many who were performing other volunteer services throughout London.

In Australia there were a great number of Jewish citizens who enlisted, but were not privileged, on account of disabilities, to serve abroad, but who, in most cases, rendered public services at Home. A number of Jewish Doctors and Dentists did admirable work in this respect, and many held commissioned ranks in the Home Forces.

In the general civilian effort Jewish men and women in every State took a leading part in war activities, particularly affecting the welfare of the troops serving abroad. In the Red Cross, Y.M.C.A., Comforts Fund, and other Public Organisations they played a conspicuous part, not only in rendering valuable services, but in generous donations towards public funds for these purposes. In each State civil honors were awarded to Jewish citizens for services so rendered.

GENERAL OFFICER COMMANDING AUSTRALIAN CORPS.



**H**IS military career dates from 1884, when he entered the Victorian Militia, receiving a commission as Lieutenant in the Victorian Garrison Artillery in the year 1887, rising through all grades to the command of the North Melbourne Artillery in 1901.

In 1908 he was appointed to the Intelligence Corps as Lieut.-Colonel, and promoted to Colonel in Command of 13th Infantry Brigade in 1913. In 1910 he won the first gold medal for military writings in the "Commonwealth Journal."

At the outbreak of this war he was appointed chief censor for Australia, and was later appointed to command the 4th Infantry Brigade of the A.I.F. He was in command of the 2nd Australian convoy of twenty-two ships, landing in Egypt in January, 1915. He commanded the 4th Brigade at the landing at Gallipoli, April 25th, 1915, "Monash" Valley being named after him. He continued in command of the 4th Brigade throughout the whole period of the occupation of Gallipoli, and was present at the evacuation. Subsequently, he served with his Brigade in the Canal zone, Egypt, until May, 1916, and then took them to France.

In July, 1916, being appointed to command the 3rd Australian Division, with rank of Major-General, he proceeded to England, where he organized, equipped and trained this Division, taking them to France in November, 1916, and he served in France until the Armistice.

He took part in the Battle of Mesines, the three phases of the Third Battle of Ypres, and the Defence of Amiens.

Created C.B. in Sept., 1915, and K.C.B. on Jan. 1st, 1918, being eight times mentioned in despatches.

He was appointed to command the Australian Army Corps in May, 1918, and promoted to the rank of Lieut.-General, and held this command till the termination of hostilities during November, 1918.

After the Armistice, General Monash was appointed Director-General of Repatriation and Demobilisation of the Australian Imperial Force, and commenced this duty on December 1st, 1918, at 54 Victoria Street, London.

He was created Grand Officer, Ordre de la Couronne, Belgium, on Oct. 18th, 1918. On Nov. 18th, 1918, he was created Grand Officer, Legion d'Honneur, France. During Nov., 1918, he was awarded the Croix de Guerre, Belgium, and also the Croix de Guerre avec Palme, France. He was created G.C.M.G. on Jan. 1st, 1919.

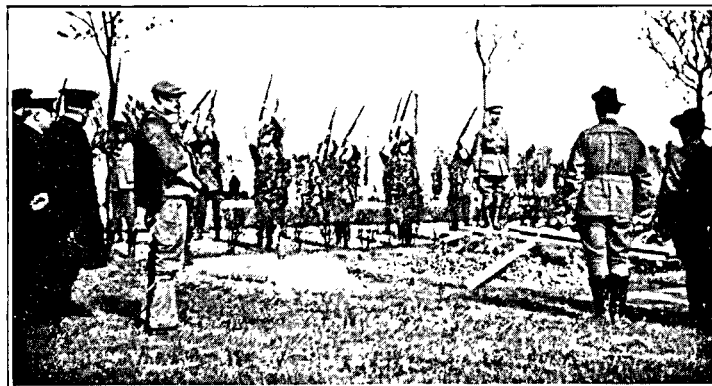
Later the President of the United States of America conferred upon him the American Distinguished Service Medal.

The hon. degrees of D.C.L., Oxford and Cambridge, were conferred on him in June and July, 1919.

KEYSOR, Leonard. V.C.

For most conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty at Lone Point trenches in the Gallipoli Peninsula. On August 7th, 1915, he was in a trench which was being heavily bombed by the enemy. He picked up two live bombs and threw them back at the enemy at great risk to his own life, and continued throwing bombs, although himself wounded, thereby saving a portion of the trench



which it was important to hold. On August 8th, at the same place, Pte. Keysor successfully bombed the enemy out of a position from which a temporary mastery over his own trench had been obtained, and was again wounded. Although marked for hospital, he declined to leave, and volunteered to throw bombs for another Company which had lost its bomb throwers. He continued to bomb the enemy till the situation was relieved.

## HONORS AND DECORATIONS, WITH CITATIONS.

AARONS, Daniel Sydney. M.C. and Bar.

This Officer is brought under notice for the very valuable work done by him during the operations on the HINDENBURG Line in front of REINCOURT on the morning of the 11th April, 1917. He went over with the first wave in the Infantry Charge made against that line unsupported by an Art. Barrage or the assistance of "Tanks" which had been expected. With great dash he led his men across unbroken enemy wire and into the trenches. By this time his Coy. Commander had been killed. He at once assumed command of his Coy. and at once reorganised it. He also assisted in organising and consolidating the whole of the positions won. He organised and led bombing attacks and set a splendid example of courage and devotion to duty to all ranks. When the situation began to be desperate on account of lack of ammunition and bombs and to the failure of proper Art. support (after consultation with the few remaining Officers) he decided to attempt to cross "No Man's Land" to bring back reliable information to H. Quarters. He succeeded in this task even though nine out of every ten of those who had previously attempted it had been shot dead immediately they had showed over the parapets. The information he brought back was invaluable and cleared up what was up to then a very uncertain position and so enabled proper Art. and M.G. fire to assist our troops when they subsequently had to retire. He is very strongly recommended for high distinction. For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in handling his Company with great skill. He made a personal reconnaissance of the enemy's position, and rendered valuable and timely support during an attack. During an enemy counter-attack he showed a very fine example of courage in encouraging his men to their highest endeavour. Throughout the whole operations his gallantry and powers of leadership were of a very high order.

BARMES, Frank Mark. Congratulated by O/C for gallant conduct.

On 14th July, an enemy shell struck a stack of 18 pdr. ammunition in the Australian Divisional Ammunition Park adjoining the Australian Ordnance Dept. setting it ablaze. The work of throwing sand and

water upon the flames was immediately taken in hand, and although a second shell fell in the immediate vicinity of the working party, and set fire to another lot of ammunition, work was not relinquished until both fires had been extinguished.

BARNETT, Max Morris. Meritorious Service Medal.

For outstanding consistent good work during the period 16/17th September, 1917, to 11th November, 1918, in connection with his duties as N.C.O. in charge of records of the 1st Pioneer Battalion in the Field. S/Sergeant Barnett has shown marked aptitude and devotion to duty, always carrying out his work in a conscientious and efficient manner. He has displayed exceptional organising ability on numerous occasions and his record of work which is perfect in its execution has been notably remarkable. A master of detail, and thoroughly reliable in his duty S/Sergeant Barnett is mainly responsible for the records of the Unit having attained such a high standard of efficiency.

BENJAMIN, Ernest. M.M.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty, particularly since the Division came to the SOMME area early in April. He has been invaluable by reason of unfailing appearance of cheerfulness, even under heaviest fire, which tended to keep the other men collected and calm. When the Battalion was employed in digging trenches from April to July inclusive, this N.C.O. was selected to assist in the important work of taping out the tasks. This had to be done before the light failed and often in localities open to observation. Following the taping out he acted as guide to bring up working parties and his faculty of quick decision allied to unfailing courage was often of great value in getting parties through a barrage to the allotted task.

BERCOVITCH, Maurice. M.M. and Bar.

This man displayed great courage, energy and resource during the whole of the operation before REINCOURT on the morning of the 11th April, 1917. One Lewis Gun team was entirely annihilated. He filled some empty magazines from the pouches of the dead and went from end to end of the section of enemy

trenches held by us looking for and finding targets. This he did for four hours and did great execution among the enemy. When the end came and he was called on to surrender, he made a dash for freedom and took his Lewis Gun with him. He is recommended for distinction. He is brought to notice for great gallantry initiative, and resource during the raiding operations near HAMEL, east of CORBIE, on the night of 15/16th June, 1918. He was a Company runner and scout and for three nights prior to the operations referred to he was in and around the German wire making special reconnaissances. His reports were accurate and extremely valuable to the Officers making the arrangements for the operations. On the night of the raid he, with another man, went with the most forward party taking a tape which was used for guiding the raiders up and back again to the Lines. Immediately the wire was destroyed he rushed through it with the tape absolutely regardless of personal danger. Once in the enemy trench he assisted in giving the Gas Alarm thereby greatly adding to the German confusion. This man is a particularly fearless and gallant soldier, and he again displayed the fine qualities which gained for him the Military Medal on 11th April, 1917. He is strongly recommended for distinction.

BLOUSTEIN, Herbert M. M.S.M.

For bravery and devotion to duty from 25th February to 16th September, 1918.

C.Q.M.S. BLOUSTEIN has at all times performed valuable work, especially in the manner in which he has brought his Company Rations and Supplies up to the front line under all conditions, even when rendered half blind by mustard gas on 24th August, 1918. He personally conducted ration parties to front line posts.

BREITMAN, George. M.M.

At Ligny, France, on 2nd March, 1917, Pte. BREITMAN showed himself fearless and quick to act by rushing out from his post to assist 2/Lieut. Boileau, who had attacked four Germans in the open. By his prompt action this man no doubt saved his Officer's life, and materially assisted in the capture of the four enemy.

BRODZIAK, Cedric Errol Meyer. D.S.O.

For most conspicuous gallantry and distinguished service near Bray-Sur-Somme on 22nd August, 1918.

Major BRODZIAK commanded the flank Company of the Division in the attack. In the face of strong opposition he captured his objectives, organised and consolidated them strongly. When the right flank of the Division on his left were held up, he made good the gaps which occurred, capturing the southern portion of Happy Valley and the Chalk Pit, which was 200 yards North of our boundary, thus assuring the advance of the Division of his flank. During the afternoon, 22nd August, the enemy broke through, and his left flank was in the air and the enemy behind him; he held his position and formed a defensive flank. By his quick appreciation of the situation, and great determination, he enabled the Divisional line to be maintained, and inflicted such casualties that the enemy was forced to withdraw. His skilful leadership, cheerful demeanour, inspired his men with the greatest confidence, and saved the situation at a critical time.

GOLDSMITH, Henry. M.C.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty when in charge of an ammunition carrying party. Having led his men to an advanced position, they came under heavy hostile fire, which exploded two of their dumps. Notwithstanding the constant explosions, however, and the fact that he was partially overcome by gas, Lieut. GOLDSMITH stuck to his task until he eventually became unconscious for half-an-hour. By his perseverance and devotion to duty he set a magnificent example.

HARLEM, Bertram Julius. M.M.

Prior to the attack on Mt. St. Quentin, North of Peronne, on 1st September, 1918, this soldier was slightly wounded by a piece of shell, but refused to be evacuated. During the operations he dressed wounded under fire and put them in places of safety. Later, when his Company attacked, he went forward with them as there was only another man left in his Lewis Gun section. On arrival at the objective he used his gun from an exposed position with very good effect and silenced two enemy machine guns. He was not evacuated until 48 hours after being wounded.

HYMAN, Arthur Wellesley. O.B.E.

For continuous good service and devotion to duty as Divisional Claims Officer.

This Officer is most conscientious in the performance

of his duties, always having the welfare of the Division at heart while investigating claims, and at the same time safe-guarding the interests of French claimants and the British Government. An Officer well worthy of recognition.

HYMAN, Eric Montague. D.S.O.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. This Officer led his squadron at full gallop against an enemy redoubt, strongly manned with machine guns and rifles. Though the hostile fire was very heavy, yet the charge was so vigorous and determined that the enemy was over-run and his fire silenced, thus enabling the regiment to continue the assault and complete the capture of the objective.

HYMAN, Joseph. M.S.M.

This Driver drives the Battery Cook's cart and during the period 29th September 1917, to 11th November, 1917, when his Battery was in action near WESTHOEK east of YPRES did not, on a single day, fail to deliver rations and stores to the gun position. On many occasions, it was impossible to pass through the barrage on the road, and the road being torn up by shell fire, he drove his cart as near as possible, and then carried the rations and stores himself to the gun position. His determination and pluck throughout enabled his comrades to get their rations, thereby assisting to keep the guns in action, and his comrades in good spirits. This Driver's devotion to duty and courage is worthy of recognition.

ISRAEL, Henry. D.C.M.

During the attack on Glencourse Wood east of Ypres on 20/9/17, Corporal Israel, who was acting as liaison N.C.O. with the 3rd Brigade on the left, rushed forward and bayoneted two Germans, who were firing their machine guns at troops of the 3rd Aust. Inf. Brigade. He then helped to rush a concrete block house where 8 prisoners were captured. After the consolidation this N.C.O. did very fine work leading carrying parties up to the front line through very heavy hostile barrages, showing great personal bravery and determination.

ISAACS, David Joseph. M.S.M.

This N.C.O. has carried out the duties of Company Quartermaster Sergeant during the period from March, 1918, and has worked untiringly to secure the comfort and well being of the men of his Company. He has personally ensured that rations have been delivered on all occasions, despite all difficulties and enemy action. He has helped to considerably increase the fighting efficiency of the men, by personally ensuring a hot meal just prior to every operation.

ISAACS, Darrell Wallace. M.C.

Near CHUIGNES on August 23rd, 1918, Capt. ISAACS showed great bravery and confidence when leading his Company in the attack. He showed great skill in the handling of his platoon and by his thorough knowledge of the situation was able to give valuable assistance to the Battalion on his left. His personal courage and confidence, which was reflected in his men, very largely helped towards our success.

ISAACS, Robert Macintosh. M.C.

For great courage, leadership, and devotion to duty. East of VILLIERS-BRETONNEUX, prior to the attack on 8th August, 1918, this Officer carried out valuable work in making out Brigade Assembly positions. When the attack was launched on the morning of 8th August, he, together with his section, accompanied the left assaulting Battalion. When at the final objective north-east of HARBONNIERES he immediately vigorously set to work on the consolidation of the captured position. As no wiring stores had yet arrived, he organised parties for collecting captured stores, and by his hard work, example and leadership, was in a large measure responsible for the rapid consolidation of the position. Throughout the operation he showed an utter disregard for his own personal safety.

JACOBS, Cecil John. M.M.

On the night of the 22nd, 23rd August, 1918, between Company Headquarters east of ETINEHEM, and Battalion Headquarters on the west edge of that village, No. 458 LANCE CORPORAL CECIL JOHN JACOBS was in charge of a section of Signallers maintaining a section of telephone line between Company and Battalion Headquarters. From two hours before ZERO,



until the attack was finished, their whole area was exceptionally heavily shelled by the enemy. Throughout the whole time, Lance Corporal Jacobs showed great courage and devotion to duty, and kept his men cheerfully working on the line during the whole night, thus enabling communication to be kept up throughout the whole period of the attack.

JACOBS, Harold Leslie. M.C.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty, during the action near MONTBREHAIN on the 5th October, 1918, N.E. St. QUENTIN. The enemy placed a heavy concentration on the 42nd Bty. Two guns were knocked out, the other Section Commander killed, and several casualties on detachments inflicted. Throughout this most trying period and notwithstanding the continued shell fire, Lieut. JACOBS with great gallantry and devotion continued to control the service of his guns and maintain the barrage fire so urgently necessary to the attacking infantry. His splendid control and service were not only valuable to the Battery, but set a very high standard of soldierly conduct to all ranks.

JOEL, John. M.M.

For conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty at Broodseinde Ridge east of Ypres on 4/10/17. This N.C.O. was sent with an advance party to reconnoitre and guide the Company into position in the forward area. The party was broken up by heavy enemy barrage, and the greater part became casualties. Sgt. Joel pressed forward, reconnoitred and alone guided 4 platoons to their positions. His courage and skill as a guide saved his Company heavy casualties. During the advance of his platoon to the 2nd objective he did excellent work in re-organising in great personal danger. His cheerfulness and bravery were beyond praise.

JOSEPH, Oliver Harold. M.M.

For exceptional devotion to duty on 3rd April near ALBERT during an enemy attack on our lines. Pte. JOSEPH who is a Stretcher-bearer, worked continuously during the fight carrying wounded from where they fell to where their wounds could be dressed. He was exposed most of the time to heavy enemy machine gun and rifle fire; but he carried on regardless of his own personal safety. He afterwards made a number

of trips to the R.A.P. assisting to carry wounded being exposed all the time to Machine gun and rifle fire, and Artillery fire. He risked everything to alleviate the sufferings of his wounded comrades and undoubtedly was the means of saving several lives.

KAYE, John Henry. M.M.

During the attack on BROODSEINDE RIDGE east of YPRES on the 4th October, 1917, this N.C.O. and another were the only survivors of the H. Qrs. Signal Section to reach the objective. He did fine work fighting and visual signalling during the advance in addition to getting their gear forward. Under heavy fire he and the other signaller ran out lines themselves to all the Coys. and linked up same promptly with Btn. H. Qrs. He then established a visual station, and in spite of heavy shelling and having his apparatus blown out and himself buried on several occasions, continued to send his messages to the rear and flanks. His flash could be observed and his position was heavily shelled. Finally all his lamps were broken and only then did he give us visual signalling. Without relief, he, in addition to this, worked the 'phone to Coys. and went out on numerous occasions in heavy barrages to mend breaks in the line. His resource, persistence, and courage set a fine example to all ranks.

KRANTZ, Sam Harold. M.M.

On the 4th July, 1918, during the attack on HAMEL, part of our line was held up by enemy M.G. With the assistance of an American N.C.O., KRANTZ rushed the post, killed the gun crew and captured the gun. He showed utter disregard for his personal safety as the enemy gun continued to fire until he was nearly up to it. By his bravery and initiative he set an excellent example to the other members of his Platoon.

LAWRENCE, Keith Francis. M.M.

This man was conspicuous for his excellent work during the recent operations near BULLECOURT. He, together with others, continued for 44 hours from 11.30 p.m. on May 5th, 1917, to 7.30 p.m. May 7th, 1917, bearing wounded from the 5th Brigade Aid Post east of BULLECOURT to the Advanced Collecting Station, NOREUIL, being under very heavy enemy shell fire, during the whole time. During this period they covered

a distance of over 30 miles. These men were in different bearer squads and kept up the morale of the bearers of their respective squads by their coolness and determination in the face of danger, and in spite of all physical fatigue.

LEEDMAN, Chas. Herbert Leopold. M.C. and Bar.

When the 54th Battalion moved on the evening of 24th September, 1917, to the old German strong point in Glencourse Wood, Captain LEEDMAN established his R.A.P. in one of the comortments. It was so small that no more than three stretchers could be taken in at one time. All casualties, therefore, had to be dressed in the open. From the evening of the 24th until the evening of the 28th, 300 cases were attended to by Captain LEEDMAN. Seven intense barrages were put down by the enemy, but he went on with his duties, showing a total disregard of danger. His courage, devotion to duty, endurance and example generally inspired all with whom he came in contact, and he undoubtedly saved many lives. His splendid work is deserving of special recognition.

On the 14th May, 1917, at R.A.P. in sunken road in rear of HINDENBURG LINE, Capt. LEEDMAN, R.M.O. of this Battalion showed great courage and devotion to duty. At 10 a.m. the enemy consistently shelled the R.A.P. situated on Sunken Road in rear of Hindenburg Line. One shell passed through the R.A.P. killing one and wounding another of the A.M.C. Staff, also wounding slightly the R.M.C. himself. Despite his wounds and the severe shaking he received Captain Leedman continued tending the cases which were waiting attention in the vicinity of the R.A.P. This place was the whole time subjected to heavy shell fire from the enemy. By his section, the Company on the road and all in the vicinity of the R.A.P. were set a splendid example of courage, endurance, and devotion to duty. Captain Leedman's wounds did not necessitate his evacuation. He remained at his post for the remainder of the day, and during the heavy bombardment and counter attack on the morning of the 15/5/17 the R.A.P. eventually became untenable.

LEVY, Albert. M.M.

Near WARNETON, during a raid on the enemy on night 30th November, 1st December, this N.C.O. showed dashing and conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He was the Sergeant in charge of the Right blocking

party. He was one of the first to enter the enemy trenches, and his example of courage, determination, and complete control of his men while under heavy fire, helped largely in the success of the operation. He was also one of the last to leave the enemy's trenches, and assisted in the bringing in of the wounded.

LEWIS, Morris. M.C.

On the 4th July, 1918, during the attack on the enemy trenches east of Hamel, this Officer was responsible for the conduct of the approach march and in placing Coys on the assembly tapes. On the final objective being reached, he assisted in the re-organisation of the Coys. and the consolidation of the position won. On the 4/5th July when the enemy delivered a strong counter attack and penetrated part of our front line, Capt. Lewis led a party forward, and was successful in driving the enemy from the trenches, inflicting severe casualties on them, and capturing several prisoners and four M.G.'s. The success of the latter operation was entirely due to the coolness and bravery with which Capt. Lewis handled the situation. By his conduct and devotion to duty he set an excellent example to the men under his command.

LEWIS, Mark. M.M.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during operations east of Ypres, 4th to 6th October, 1917. He followed closely behind the attacking troops, dressing the wounded as they fell. When the R.A.P. was established he continued his work in the open under heavy shell fire. Throughout the operations he showed a splendid example to those near him by his coolness and courage.

LISSNER, Hyman. M.M.

In the vicinity of Chuignolles on 23/8/18 under heavy shell and machine gun fire Sgt. Lissner reconnoitred a position for a strong point, and during the construction of same set a splendid example of fearlessness and disregard of personal safety. His conduct and example were mainly responsible for the successful completion of the strong point.

LITTMAN, Solomon.

M.M.

On 25th September, 1917, during the attack on Zonnebeke Ridge, this man did excellent work as Runner between Battalion H.Q. and the front line, carrying messages under heavy fire, and at very great personal risk. All messages to the front line had to be carried over the open for several hundred yards in full view of enemy snipers, who looked down at the position from higher ground, and yet, although a number of runners became casualties, this man was conspicuous for the manner in which he always carried out his work, cheerfully and got through with his message.

LOFFMAN, Phillip.

M.M.

This man is brought under notice for very gallant conduct near Zonnebeke on the night of September 25th, 1917. He was told off with others on the night in question to go back to get the rations for his Company. When on the way down a shell dropped among the party, killing or wounding all with the exception of himself. He was knocked over and very badly shaken, but quickly got to work on the wounded, and after attending to their most urgent needs, getting them to a spot where the shelling was not so heavy, he went to get help for carrying them in. He personally helped to take the whole of the wounded to the dressing station, and it was undoubtedly due to him that many valuable lives were saved. Because of the severe shaking which he received his Company Commander offered him work which would have kept him out of the attack which took place next morning, but he refused the offer, and his work on the morning of the 26th September was in keeping with that of the night before. He is strongly recommended for distinction.

MAYER, J.

M.C.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on September 6th, 1918, near NEUVILLE in command of a forward section of guns. He kept them close up to the infantry in face of intense machine gun fire, and kept them in action all day in close co-operation with the infantry, dealing with field guns and machine guns near HAVRINCOURT WOOD. One of his guns was put out of action, and he had heavy casualties to men and horses. This is not the first time he has distinguished himself.

MARKS, J. D.

M.C.

For conspicuous gallantry during operations near RUYAULCOURT on September 4/5th, 1918. While his R.A.P. was twice heavily shelled and several casualties occurred he continued at duty, binding men up and shifting them to shelter in spite of the heavy bombardment. Again on September 7th, when the R.A.P. had been established on the edge of HAVRINCOURT WOOD near QUOTIENT AVENUE, the enemy bombarded the place heavily. Under this fire, which had inflicted a number of casualties he continued with his work. On both occasions his devotion to duty was admirable.

MARKS, Cecil Henry.

M.M.

For conspicuous gallantry during an attack on the enemy trenches near Villiers Bretonneux on the evening of July 17th, 1918. The Platoon to which this man belonged was held up by an enemy strong post, firing his Lewis gun from the hip. After the enemy post had been cleaned up, he discovered that all the N.C.O.'s had become casualties. He at once took command of the Platoon, rallied the men, and led them on in the attack, rendering a few minutes later, very valuable assistance to another Platoon in difficulties. There is no doubt that this man, by his initiative and bravery, saved what would have been a dangerous situation.

MENDELSON, Harris.

M.C.

During operations in the vicinity of Montbrehain, on 5th Oct., 1918, soon after the attack had been launched he pushed his aid post forward under heavy shell fire, and established it at a most advanced position. Throughout the day he worked unceasingly, showing fearless devotion to duty, and was the means of saving many lives.

PHILLIPS, Morris.

D.C.M.

At Perillon on the morning of the 28th July, 1916, after the Company had completed the Communication sap across "No Man's Land" this N.C.O. did excellent work in carrying and organising small grenade-carrying parties from a dump in our original firing line to the occupied German trenches. By this action he was largely responsible for maintaining the supply of grenades across "No Man's Land," and thus allowing the men holding the trenches to maintain their position. Later, whilst the retirement was taking place Corporal

Phillips took up a position on the top of our own parapet in full view of the enemy, determined to do his utmost, should the enemy follow our retirement. Here he remained under shell and rifle fire, setting a fine example to his comrades by his courage and coolness and helping to steady the men who were retiring to our own trenches.

PHILLIPS, Philip David. M.M.

Under hostile shell fire during the heavy enemy attack this N.C.O. showed initiative and courage on the 30th March, 1918, in the vicinity of Vaux-Sur-Somme in repairing quickly telephone lines (between Brigade Headquarters and Batteries) which were frequently cut—thus enabling valuable enemy targets to be passed to the Batteries at a critical time. He exhibited great devotion to duty and disregard of personal danger.

ROSENBERG, Julius Myer. M.M.

At Bullecourt this man was one of the blocking party who advanced with the first wave of the 19th Battalion. He ably assisted his N.C.O. in carrying up stikes, mortars and blowing in the sides of the trench. He showed bravery and determination carrying out the work.

SAMUELS, Louis. M.C.

For gallantry and devotion to duty at Jeaneourt on 18th September, 1918, Lieut. Samuels was in charge of the F.O.O. Party, and throughout the whole advance maintained communications with the Group Headquarters both by telephone and C.W. wireless set, his lines were often the only ones available for both Artillery and Infantry use. Advancing with the Company commanders he sent valuable information as to progress made and location of the enemy, artillery and infantry.

SANDER, Cyril. M.M.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in the vicinity of BELLICOURT-NAUROY from 22/9/18 to 1/10/18. Early on the 29/9/18 this N.C.O. was blown up by a shell and at the same time wounded in the leg. Although badly shaken he refused to leave his section. Later, owing to heavy casualties amongst the N.C.O.'s.

he assumed command of his Platoon and although suffering intense pain, he carried on for two days, not reporting for medical attention until his Coy. had been relieved. Whilst his Coy. were holding the front line, his Platoon came under an intense enemy barrage. With an utter disregard for personal safety he succeeded in extricating his section without loss. Throughout the whole of the action he carried out valuable reconnaissance work under heavy and continuous fire. The self-sacrificing devotion to duty and gallantry displayed by this man was an inspiring example to all.

SANDERS, Algernon Benjamin. M.M.

On 27/9/17 at POLYGON WOOD near YPRES, this man went out and brought in three wounded men, dressed them, and got them to a place of safety. This man had been on duty continuously from night, 25/26/9/17. This was done under heavy shell and M.G. fire.

SELIG, Oscar Moritz. M.M.

For bravery and devotion to duty during the operations N.W. of POIZERES 29/31st August. He was a Btn. runner and worked for 48 hours without rest and was continually exposed to the greatest danger from shells and snipers. His courage and devotion to duty are very highly recommended.

STEINBERG, Lawrence Solomon. M.M.

On the 4th July, 1918, during the attack on HAMEL, Pte. STEINBERG maintained communication between Coy. and Btn. Hd. Quarters throughout the whole operation, although continuously under heavy Art. Fire. On two occasions his signal station was destroyed by enemy fire. Obtaining further instruments, on each occasion, he was successful in re-establishing his station. By his devotion to duty and his utter disregard for his own personal safety, he set an excellent example to the other members of his Section.

TOFLER, Louis Judah. M.C.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. During the attack on PERONNE on 1st September, 1918, he led his platoon forward, displaying remarkable courage and leadership. Shortly after "jumping off" his

platoon was held up by a strong belt of wire directly in front of an enemy strong point, the machine gun fire being intense. Despite this Lt. TOFLER crawled forward with two men and attempted to cut the wire, and while doing so was wounded severely in the right shoulder. He encouraged his men to continue with the task although bleeding freely. When the gap was cut he insisted upon being lifted up in utter disregard to his own safety, and led the remnants of his platoon forward, shooting the entire crew of one machine gun with his left hand. 14 prisoners and two machine guns were captured at this post. Although unable to go further forward himself, he rallied his men, inspiring all by his splendid fighting spirit, and sent them forward. He lay for many hours at this strong point, refusing to be attended to until the whole of his wounded men had been evacuated.

WALTERS, Philip.

M.M.

During the operations east of Mt. St. Quentin near Peronne on 3/9/18 this N.C.O. was engaged with a bombing party in bombing the enemy out of a portion of trench required to establish our line. His Officer being killed early in the operation, he took charge of his party, and when it was held up by enemy machine gun fire he decided to go forward himself, with one volunteer to attack the position. By great courage and daring he attacked and dispersed the enemy, thus allowing his party to establish a post at the required position. Although subjected to several attacks by the enemy, his party under his direction, beat them off and held the position until assistance arrived.

WAXMAN, Clive Raymond.

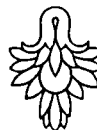
M.M.

For most conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at LAVIEVILLE near ALBERT on 24/4/18. This N.C.O. was a member of a patrol, and, knowing that identifications were required, volunteered to carry out, in company with an officer, a reconnaissance of the enemy posts. While engaged in this task they were attacked by a party of enemy and the Officer was mortally wounded. Sgt. WAXMAN at once engaged the enemy with revolver and bombs and dispersed their patrol, causing them casualties. He then pulled his Officer under cover and remained with him until he died. Although in an exposed and dangerous position, subject to heavy fire, this N.C.O. crawled back over the open and rejoined the balance of his patrol, carrying with him the body of his Officer, and thus preventing any possible identifications falling into enemy hands. Throughout the encounter Sgt. WAXMAN displayed unusual courage and coolness.

WOOLFE, Hyman Eltman.

M.M.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on the 2/9/18 near MONT St. QUENTIN near PERONNE. This Driver was lead Driver of a gun team which was heavily shelled on coming into action on two occasions. On each occasion his steadiness and initiative in leading and directing his team was responsible for getting his gun into action. Later he returned to the wagon lines and brought up ammunition under heavy shell fire. Still later at night he returned again and alone brought up rations and stores to his gun detachment.
